The combined funds are valued at more than a million dollars and annual grant distributions from the accumulated funds continue to grow each year and provide 5% of the market value of the Fund calculated on a three year rolling average which provides \$50 - \$55,000 each year for grants. Grants are approved by the Board of Trustees at the November Board Meeting. Grant funds are available for the following calendar year.

## **OWEN GARRIOTT AND HELEN GARRIOTT ENDOWMENT FBO ENID ARTS AND SCIENCE FOUNDATION**

The fund consists of donations from both Owen Garriott and Helen Garriott. They requested on August 14, 2002, that the funds being held by the Enid Community Foundation be combined creating a sizable endowment for Enid Arts & Science Foundation (aka Leonardo's).

Owen K. Garriott (Ph.D.) a former NASA Astronaut was born November 22, 1930 in Enid, Oklahoma. He graduated from Enid High School in 1948; received a B.S. in Electrical Engineering from the University of Oklahoma in 1953, and a M.S. and Ph.D. from Stanford University in 1957 and 1960, respectively. In 1965 he was one of the first six Scientist-Astronauts selected by NASA. His first space flight aboard Skylab in 1973 set a new world record for duration. He raised his family in a Houston neighborhood close to Johnson Space Center. He was a former Stanford physics professor and Navy officer who had been tapped by the manned space flight program and his family had become a part of the tight-knit NASA circle. Their own immediate circle- sons, Richard, Randy, and Robert; a younger sister Linda; and Helen, Garriott's free-spirited, accomplished artist wife – was even tighter. They all shared the limelight briefly in 1973, when Owen went up in the Skylab 3 for 59 days, doubling the amount of time any human had been in space. Growing up in that environment tended to undermine any kid's sense of the impossible.

Owen Garriott and Helen Garriott have generously donated items from their collections to Leonardos and Adventure Quest, as well as, their generous on-going support.

## **ENID ARTS AND SCIENCE FOUNDATION CONSOLIDATED FUND**

Helen Mary Walker Garriott and Dr. Owen K. Garriott wanted to give back to their childhood community. They gave the seed money to launch "Leonardo's."

In September of 1992, the Enid Arts and Science Foundation, a 501 c 3 organization, was formed. A Board of Directors was created with many dedicated community advocates. In November of 1992, the building that now houses the "Discovery Warehouse" and the land on which "Adventure Quest" has been built was purchased.

The next goal was to raise over a million dollars for renovations and start-up equipment and exhibits. They wrote grants, gave talks to local civic groups, made personal requests, etc. Through the efforts of many, many families and companies who believed in their concept, their first challenge was met and the renovations began.

The success of the "Adventure Quest" project is directly linked to the amount of hard word and dedication that the captains and coordinators donated. Their names are located on the north fence area.

Completed, "Adventure Quest" has an estimated value of over three million dollars. Because of the volunteer labor, equipment, and donated materials, the actual cost is approximately one-half. In a radius of 185 miles, the target group includes 712,743 students.

The Enid Arts and Sciences Foundation believes that the education of our children is the responsibility of our families, schools, the community as well as cultural organizations. Leonardo's was created to provide innovative education opportunities and is dedicated to the idea that children of all ages learn best when having fun through participatory exhibits, and programs.

### **RALPH AND WIN GOLEY NUTRITION FUND FIELD OF INTEREST FUND**

R. Gene Goley, Vera Jo Goley Brewer and Frank R. Goley established the fund in the memory of their parents.

Field of Interest Funds are tied to a general area of interest and not to a specific organization. ECF uses the Donor's suggestions and other criteria to select grant recipients.
